**PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE****Chief Kenn Taylor****Violet Twp. Fire Department, OH**

Great things continue to happen within the IAFC and the Great Lakes Division. A lot of really talented people are working very hard on your behalf.

I had the privilege to attend the Second Line of Duty Death Prevention Summit, which turned out to be an awesome two-day experience. The sixteen Life Safety Initiatives that we should all be so familiar with were reviewed, modified and enhanced in an effort to prevent firefighter deaths. The results of this summit will be available to all of us soon. Remember . . . make every day a training day so that everyone goes home!

The stakeholders for the IAFC's Intrastate Mutual Aid (IMAS) met in Columbus, Ohio during the first week of March. Nearly twenty-one states now have intrastate mutual aid programs in place as a result of the IAFC's assistance. The participants also had an opportunity to observe first-hand a true test of the Ohio Fire Chiefs Emergency Response. A large-scale mobilization took place, which delivered ninety-eight pieces of equipment (fire, EMS and law enforcement) within ninety-eight minutes to a designated staging area. What a tremendous accomplishment!

Forum 2007 took place in the middle of April at Miller Park in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. We teamed up with the Milwaukee Brewers for an incredible two-day event. Everyone in attendance agreed this truly was one of the best forums ever! The lessons learned from the Brewers association were very fitting for us. Additionally, the Brewers were challenged logistically when the adverse weather conditions (think snow plows) in Cleveland forced the Cleveland Indians to move their three-game stretch with the California Angels to the under-roof Brewers facility in Milwaukee. What a last minute logistical nightmare the Brewers organization was handed! However, they "stepped up to the plate" and literally "hit a home run" by pulling off a spectacular event while simultaneously hosting the Great Lakes Forum. I personally want to express my sincere appreciation to not only the Milwaukee Brewers for hosting us, but also to Jeff Roemer of R.W. Management for coordinating the entire event. Well done Jeff!

I just returned from the IAFC Spring Board Meeting, which was held in conjunction with the Fire Rescue Med Conference in Las Vegas. I continue to be amazed by just how active this board is, and how much is on their plate. Even more amazing is how the IAFC staff is able to keep all the different programs afloat and moving forward. It truly is an impressive group to be affiliated with.

I hope all is going well for everyone, and that you're preparing for a safe and enjoyable summer.

I write this letter as I have just returned from our Spring IAFC Board meeting held in Las Vegas, NV in recognition of the EMS Section's 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Fire Rescue Med.

The Board reviewed and approved the Committee Reform Task Force report presented by 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President Kelvin Cochran. In general, the report modified the Policy regarding Committees and representation on the Committees. The main purpose of the change is to try to encourage wider participation by IAFC members on our Committees. This is accomplished by limiting the tenure on Committees to six years, with a possibility of nine years in exceptional situations. It also affirms that Committee appointments are for three year terms.

The Board also reviewed and approved the audit report from our auditing firm. Again, we had a clean audit and the financial affairs of the Association are in good shape. New IRS rules require a conflict of interest policy be established for the Board, so the Board also took action on that and approved a Conflict of Interest Policy. The Emergency Management Committee gave a status report at the meeting. Phases one and two of the intrastate mutual aid efforts are nearly complete in the 21 designated states. Phase three intends to reach out to the other 29 states, but probably will be limited to the 48 continental states first.

In other business, the Board approved hiring a Membership Sales Manager position for the IAFC. The consultant's report indicated that this position could very well pay for itself threefold in the first year. The Board approved the position for a one year period and will review the results at the end of the first year.

By the time you read this, we should be very close to sending a recommendation to the full Board for our next Executive Director. We will be interviewing four finalists on the 14<sup>th</sup> of May, with any final interviews scheduled for the 30<sup>th</sup> of May. Our goal is to have our next Executive Director on board by FRI-2007 in Atlanta.

My bid for 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President is getting close to the end. The ballots come out the 25<sup>th</sup> of May. I thank you for all of your support in the past, and hope you will see fit to vote for me when you receive your ballot.

Other fire service representatives included Tod Doebler of the Wisconsin Fire Inspectors Association and Larry Plumer, Jim Stormer, and Todd Blaser of the Wisconsin State Firefighters Association.

WSFCA Annual Conference

In an effort to follow the successes of Gordon Graham and Billy Goldfeder at the past two WSFCA Annual Conferences, the Board of Directors has invited nationally known fire service speaker Harry Carter to present at the 2007 pre-conference. The topics of the pre-conference session, scheduled for June 21<sup>st</sup> at the Kalahari Resort and Conference Center in Wisconsin Dells, will be Leadership in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century and Problem-Solving and Team Building. The regular conference, which begins Friday morning June 22<sup>nd</sup>, will feature general session speaker Fire Chief Mary Beth Michos of Prince William County, Virginia. Her topic will be "Your Emotional Intelligence, A Key for Success". The Saturday general session will be an overview of the Door County Propane Explosion by Sister Bay Fire Chief Chris Hecht.

State Building and Fire Code

Progress is being made on the adoption of an updated Wisconsin Enrolled Building Code that will require sprinklers in new multi-family residential occupancies. Also on the legislative agenda is fire safe cigarette legislation that is based on the national model adopted or being considered by other Great Lakes Division states. When enacted, these changes will be a major step toward in fire safety in Wisconsin.

It looks like spring is finally here. We didn't have a long winter but we had a lot of winter in a short period of time. It didn't snow until after New Years and in about 2 months we exceeded our average annual snowfall. Of course with spring comes the construction season which I'm sure is the same everywhere else. It sure can wreak havoc on emergency responses.

The Mutual Aid Committee is moving forward developing a plan for intra-state mutual aid and interstate mutual aid. The committee includes representatives from the Fire Service as well as the state Emergency Management Division. We have decided to utilize the MABAS plan for our mutual aid both intra-state and interstate. We looked at emergency response plans that are already in operation and felt that MABAS would be the simplest for us to implement.

The MAFC is busy finalizing their plans for the Summer Leadership Conference. It is going to be held in Bay City July 25-27, 2007. The conference committee has put together a good program for this year. One of the programs is how cultural diversity can impact the safety of our firefighters and our customers. Another program is on labor relations and other fire department legal issues. There will also be presentations from FEMA Region 5 and our state Emergency Management Division

The MAFC has changed their by-laws to allow the formation of Sections as part of the organization. Our first group has made application to become an MAFC Section. That group is HazMat. We are hoping that other Fire Service disciplines also will apply to become a Section in the MAFC. We believe having sections will make us a stronger organization and that it will also increase membership.

One of the more important efforts that is going on right now is finding adequate funding for the new Bureau of Fire Services. Currently they are significantly under funded for providing the services that the Fire Service needs. As part of this effort the Fire Service Coalition which consists of members from all the major state fire service organizations is organizing a strategic planning session with the Bureau of Fire Services (BFS). One of the primary purposes for this meeting is to develop a business plan in order to determine what the BFS actually needs in order to function properly. Once that is done then they will explore possible sources of revenue.

Chiefs is in the process of forming Incident Management Teams throughout the state. The state has been divided into regions for the purpose of determining funding needs for Homeland Security projects and to disperse those funds. Our goal is to have at least one IMT in each region. They are trying to be recognized as Type III IMTs but the training required for Type III certification is difficult to get.

The MAFC is working on several pieces of legislation. One that we are very concerned with is the proposed changes to our Fireworks Legislation. We are adamantly opposed to the new law and we are working hard to keep it from passing. We are also working at passing legislation for safe cigarettes. There is a cancer presumption bill in committee we are working hard to get that passed. That is going to be a tough battle.

Finally we are working locally and nationally to change the construction code in order to require residential sprinkler systems in one and two family residences. That looks like it is going to be tough to accomplish but we believe it is possible.

### **AIRPORT TRANSPORTATION**

Flying into town? MARTA connects into the terminal building at Atlanta Hartsfield International Airport, just follow the signs. Rail cars are equipped with ample baggage space. Trains depart every 8 to 10 minutes.

reader. Ask the driver for a transfer ticket when you board.

MARTA is the most cost-effective way to travel in Atlanta, and the most convenient, with a wide variety of fares and passes available to meet each rider's needs. Regular riders can choose from several TransCard, Half Fare or individual token rates, while out-of-towners can utilize a specially-priced visitor's transit pass. It's good for unlimited travel aboard the extensive rail and bus system. The regular fare is \$1.75 for transportation throughout the system and may be paid with tokens or exact change. Tokens can be purchased individually or in rolls of 10 at the entrances to MARTA stations or at all RideStores.

There are many hotels offered for attendees to FRI with rates that vary from \$139 to \$205. The Great Lakes Division has chosen the Peachtree Westin Center with a room rate of \$159 Sing/DbL. The Westin is centrally located half way between the convention center and the Hyatt Regency which is the headquarters for the IAFC. The hotel is located a few blocks from the convention center overlooking Centennial Olympic Park and provides breathtaking views in every direction. The hotel has just recently been completely renovated and provides Westin's "Heavenly Bed and Bath" in every room.

The Westin also offers a Lobby Bar, full service Starbucks, The Cafe, which features casual dining, and The Sun Dial Restaurant located 723 feet above the city slowly rotating for your dining pleasure.

The Westin has an Extensive Fitness Center for conditioning or recreational activities and a large indoor pool with a retractable roof.

Either valet, at a rate of \$20 per night which includes in and out privileges, or self parking is available . Although as mentioned above, the MARTA can be used from the airport for those not renting a car.
